## Five Features of PCOMS:

There are five features of training and implementation of client directed, outcome informed (CDOI) clinical work and the Partners for Change Outcome Management System (PCOMS) that distinguish HSCP.

PCOMS is an outcome management system designed to give clients the voice they deserve and level the therapeutic process, as well as provide clients, clinicians, administrators, and payers with feedback about the client's response to services, thus enabling more effective care tailored to client preferences.

1. PCOMS, the feedback intervention, is viewed as an interconnected part of the healing factors of psychotherapeutic intervention and the tie that binds the other factors together allowing the factors to be expressed one client at a time.
2. A focus on the clinical nuances of using PCOMS as detailed in *On Becoming a Better Therapist*, addressing how to get the maximum feedback effect.
3. Focus on therapist development and how therapists naturally want to get better over the course of their careers provides a positive motivation for therapists to invest time and energy in PCOMS.
4. Attention to Multiculturalism and Social Justice is a key element of PCOMS
5. Attention to the concept of "Recovery" as defined by the National Consensus Statement is core to PCOMS and a natural fit—a journey best directed by the individual in the context of a true partnership providing both hope and accountability.
